Comment: The initiative is designed to support an ambitious revamping of the education system by increasing access to information, civic participation and public accountability.

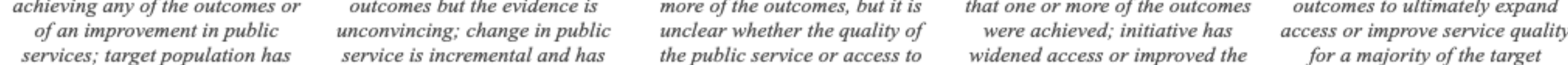

Comment: There is a plan to scale up this initiative but it is more a public policy for education than an initiative of open government



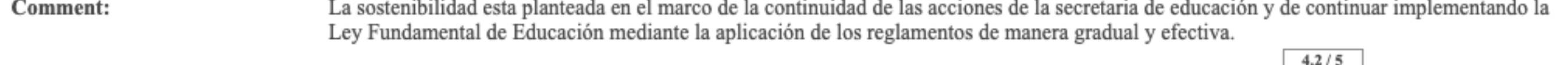

Comment: this initiative improved the education system. The kids are the vulnerable population that benefit from this initiative



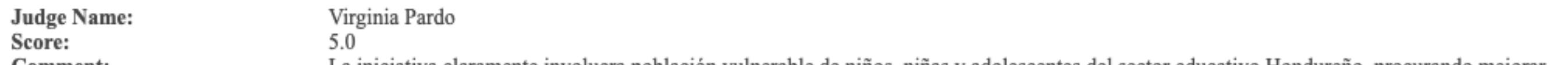
